REFLECTION:

Even if you saw, would you believe? Those gathered witnessing the apostles speaking in tongues supposed them drunk! It's not a guarantee that seeing a miracle or sign will cause one to believe. The church teaches us that we may know God in a few ways:

- 1) Proof of God's existence can be achieved through the light of man's natural reason.**
- 2) By revelation in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition together.**
- 3) By faith.**

Faith is a grace given by God, and is also a human act. Grace allows us to more easily recognize and give accent to revealed truths about God. The human act of faith is the willingness to trust and give assent of the mind and intellect to those revealed truths. Faith excludes doubt and an "inquisitive curiosity", which is a demanding of God to provide the reason and cause for His Divine judgements. Faith calls us to rest content in the knowledge of eternal truths, and to have an unchangeable faith, as the truth is unchangeable, as God, who is truth, is unchangeable. (Catechism of the Council of Trent Art.1)

Our responsibility is summed up in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (30): "But this search for God demands of man every effort of intellect, a sound will, an upright heart, as well as the witness of others who teach him to seek God."

Catholic Catechesis:

Did not our hearts burn while he opened the scriptures to us!

Why was it difficult for the disciples to recognize the risen Lord? Jesus' death scattered his disciples and shattered their hopes and dreams. They had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. They saw the cross as defeat and could not comprehend the empty tomb until the Lord Jesus appeared to them and gave them understanding.

St. Augustine of Hippo (354-430 AD) reflects on the dimness of their perception:

"They were so disturbed when they saw him hanging on the cross that they forgot his teaching, did not look for his resurrection, and failed to keep his promises in mind" (Sermon 235.1).

Jesus chided the disciples on the road to Emmaus for their slowness of heart to believe what the Scriptures had said concerning the Messiah. They did not recognize the risen Jesus until he had broken bread with them. Do you recognize the Lord in his word and in the breaking of the bread?
