REFLECTION:

The spirit of the Lenten season is of penance and the honouring of our baptism. Penance especially is the detestation of sin for the offense it gives God. But how does one attain this? We have to humble ourselves before the Lord, and ask for this grace. We must ask to love God such that you would rather die than offend him. It is only through love of God that we may detest sins for the offence they give God, our eternal beloved.

As a communal act of penance, I'm asking all parishioners to stay in their pews until the end of Mass, until I've processed out if I had indeed processed in, or if not that, until I've kissed the altar and retired to the sacristy.

I encourage all parishioners to take five to ten minutes after this period to be with Jesus with whom they have just been united to through the Holy Eucharist. Profess your love and gratitude for Him and the victory over death he won for you. Die to sin through His death on the cross, and live not according to the flesh, but live in the Spirit according to His resurrection. His death and victory for you is now. Be united to Jesus in His death and His victory. Ask for it.

“O good Jesus, crucified for us; nail my will to your cross, for love of Thee.”
