Holy Communion is the climactic moment of the Mass, where heaven touches earth and the faithful are invited to the wedding supper of the Lamb—a phrase drawn from Revelation 19:9. This is no ordinary meal; it is a mystical union between Christ, the divine Bridegroom, and the Church, His bride. The Eucharist is a foretaste of the eternal banquet in heaven, where the saints cry out "Hallelujah!" in praise of the Lamb who was slain and now reigns in glory. When the priest proclaims, "Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb," we are reminded that this invitation is sacred, and that we approach the altar not as spectators, but as brides—beloved, chosen, and drawn into covenantal communion with Christ.

Before receiving Communion, we respond with the humble words: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." This echoes the faith of the Roman centurion in Matthew 8, who recognized both his unworthiness and Christ's power to heal. In this moment, we acknowledge our need for mercy and the miracle of grace that allows us to receive Christ Himself. Our response to Communion should be one of awe, gratitude, and transformation. Let each "Amen" be a personal Hallelujah—a joyful yes to the Lamb's invitation. And as you return to your pew, let your heart be open to the healing, peace, and mission that flow from this sacred encounter.
