COMMUNITY INFORMATION:

Parish Financial Procedures

Please take note of the following financial guidelines for our parish:

- The pastor is **not responsible** for any money left unattended anywhere in the church (including the sacristy, office door, mail slots, or any other location).
- If you need to have money officially recorded or placed in the parish safe, it **must be handed directly to the pastor in person**. An acknowledgement receipt—signed by both parties after confirming the amount—will be issued. A copy of this receipt will be kept in the parish office for parish records.
- Regular donations are made through the **Weekend Mass offerings**. The designated counters will bag these offerings and place them in the safe until the scheduled counting time.
- For fundraising events or other special collections, please follow the **Finance Council procedures** established for the parish. These guidelines will be made available.

Reimbursements

- Any project, purchase, or work requiring reimbursement must receive **prior approval from the pastor**, in accordance with diocesan financial policy.
- All bills, invoices, and receipts must be given **directly to the pastor in person**. Please do not leave them in the church, sacristy, letterbox, or any other location.
- If submitting multiple receipts, please provide a **list of each item and the total amount requested** to ensure clarity.
