In the *Communion Rite* of the Catholic Mass, the Fraction Rite begins with the priest breaking the consecrated host—a gesture that recalls Christ's body broken for us on the cross. Though practical in preparing the Eucharist for distribution, this act carries profound theological meaning. It echoes the moment on the road to Emmaus when the disciples recognized the risen Lord in the breaking of bread. During this rite, the priest also performs the commingling, placing a small piece of the host into the chalice. This quiet but powerful gesture symbolizes the unity of Christ's Body and Blood, once separated in death and now reunited in His resurrection, affirming the fullness of life offered to us in the Eucharist.

Accompanying these actions is the **Agnus Dei**, or **Lamb of God** litany, sung or recited by the congregation. This prayer invokes Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, echoing John the Baptist's proclamation and the imagery of the Passover lamb. The repeated pleas — "have mercy on us" — culminate in "grant us peace," linking the mercy of Christ to the peace we seek before receiving Him. It's a moment of reflection and humility, preparing our hearts to encounter the living God. So here's a suggestion: As you witness the breaking of the bread and pray the Agnus Dei, let it be more than ritual—let it be personal. Offer your own brokenness to Christ. Ask Him to unite it with His. In that surrender, you may find the peace and healing your soul truly longs for.
