All three readings for this Sunday highlight that we, our bodies and souls, are God's temple. Saint Paul teaches us that the spiritual work that we do to adorn our "temples", will be tested and rewarded according to the nature of the work. He points out that we can do the work, but the cause of the effects is God. He is talking about our advancement in holiness, which is, "the adornment of the soul with all the virtues and excellence in sanctifying grace". If the work is of God, we will merit in heaven. If the work is of the flesh, it will burn in the fire that He tests it by. We will have lost what we worked for if the work be of the flesh, and will ourselves be purified by fire, as Saint Paul says, a clear reference to purgatory. But if we destroy the temple, God will destroy us. That destruction that we can do to the temple of the Lord is mortal sin.

Things we can do regarding the work of adorning the soul with all the virtues and obtaining excellence in grace are: Maintain yourself in a state of sanctifying grace by avoiding mortal sin and going to confession often. Live an authentic Catholic, sacramental life, especially partaking of the Holy Eucharist. Pray daily, especially the prayers of meditation and contemplation. Study and know the faith through the Church's teachings, doctrines and dogmas, and Holy Scripture and incorporate them into ourselves and lives.

For full context, read Ezekiel 47: 1-12, 1 Cor 3: 11-17, John 2: 13-22.

Catholic Catechesis:

Jesus cleanses the Temple!

Jesus' dramatic cleansing of the temple was seen by his disciples as a prophetic sign of God's action. The temple was understood as the dwelling place of God among his people. Jesus' cleansing of the temple is also a prophetic sign of what he wants to do with each of us. He ever seeks to cleanse us of sin and make us living temples of his Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 3:16 and 6:19) He did not merely 'cast them out' but also 'overturned the tables' and 'poured out the money,' so that they could see how someone who threw himself into such danger for the good order of the house could never despise his master. *Jesus' disciples recalled the prophetic words* from Psalm 69: "Zeal for your house will consume me". This was understood as a prophecy describing the Messiah. Here the disciples saw more clearly Jesus as the Messiah who burned with zeal for the house of God. We see Jesus acting in a way to purify and confirm the temple as a place of worship dedicated to God, his Father!
