## REFLECTION:

---

This Sunday's readings warn of the reality of judgement and to attend to our eternal fate. We are admonished by the apostle of Jesus to not live in idleness and disorder, but to harken to the traditions and ways which have been handed down to us from the apostles, through the Church. At the time of the apostles and church fathers, there was already a struggle to adhere to the true teachings as communicated by them because of false teachers and teachings. But we are not to fear these seditions, nor the signs, tribulations and persecutions to come before the day of judgement; "they must come" Jesus says. And those who hold to the true teachings, the true church, the true religion, which is carried on by the Holy Roman Catholic Church, the bride of Christ, will "gain their souls". Prepare yourself though for the betrayals, even of family, for holding to the truth that is Jesus Christ, for he himself says some of us will be delivered up by them for the sake of "him" and even put to death. Our preparation is not to be what we will say to them, but rather the conviction and determination to live the true faith, no matter what. It is not popular today to even assert that there is a "true faith" or a "true religion". It's not "ecumenical" they say, "it's not kind", "it's hateful and intolerant" they say. What does Jesus say about it? What do the apostles say about it? What do the Saints say about it? Contrast that to what the "world" says about it and make your choice. Which way you will live? What work you will do? What order will you pattern yourself after? Such is the charge of the apostle of Jesus, and Jesus himself. ### Godly Endurance
